

Robert [Bob) Monahan May 28, 1946 - February 29, 2024

Robert "Bob" Monahan, 77, passed away Thursday, February 29, 2024, at the VA Hospital in Des Moines.

Bob enlisted in the Air Force in 1964 and was honorably discharged in 1972. He was wounded during his tour in Vietnam and was stationed in England AF Base in LA and then back at Edwards AF Base in CA for the F111 A test program. Bob was awarded the Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, Air Force Good Conduct Medal w/1 OLC, Air Force Longevity Service Award, Vietnam Service Medal Republic of Vietnam Campaign. After his military service Bob returned home to help farm and run the livestock operation. He worked as a truck driver, did construction and was co-owner of Bolt Security. Bob retired from the U.S. Postal Service in 2004, with over 30 years combined in federal service. Bob enjoyed shooting at the FD rifle and pistol club, fishing, and traveling. He will be remembered for his generous heart and being humble in his charitable contributions to a variety of non-profit organizations.
